

# TEACHING IDEAS



## English

- Write a letter to the headteacher asking if the class can hold a fundraising event for BBC Children in Need.
- Write a newspaper report about BBC Children in Need. Use our [Twinkl Newspaper Writing Frames](#) to support children's writing.
- Children could design an invitation asking Pudsey Bear to come to their BBC Children in Need fundraising event, using our [Twinkl Invitation Template](#).

## Maths

- Work out different amounts of money that your class could raise for BBC Children in Need. For example, how much would the class raise if each pupil donated £1? £2? More able pupils could work out amounts such as £1.50 per child. Less able pupils could work out how much a smaller group of children would raise. Coins could be used to make it a practical activity.
- Create word problems connected to fundraising events. For example, cakes are 10p each, how much money would be raised for BBC Children in Need if \_\_\_\_\_ cakes are sold? Children could also make their own word problems.
- Children can go on a spot hunt around school. How many spots can they find?

## Science

## Art/DT

- Design a poster encouraging people to donate money to BBC Children in Need.
- Design a new bandana for Pudsey.

Examples include 'Children in Need Medley' by Peter Kay's Animated All Star Band, 'Perfect Day' by Lou Reed and various artists, 'If you want to help' by BBC Children in Need Choir or 'Wake Me Up' by Gareth Malone's All Star Choir. Children can talk about which songs they liked and why.

## Computing
